Prep students at Camperdown College engage in a structured synthetic phonics approach, called Sounds-Write, each day as part of their literacy learning. This exploration continues throughout the College with all year levels growing their phonics understanding through thorough teaching and learning.

Phonics is the process whereby students understand that the words we say can be communicated and mapped with symbols (that we call letters). Understanding this process thoroughly helps us become expert readers, writers and spellers.

The implementation of this phonics approach throughout Camperdown College is highly regarded by other schools and is showing exceptional results with the reading and writing development of our students. Camperdown College is currently one of only two Sounds-Write trainer schools within Australia due to the strength of our phonics teaching from Prep – Year 6: something we are extremely proud of!

**Reading:** Camperdown College students engage in a daily literacy block where they are immersed in the reading process. Students listen to and engage in shared and modelled reading experiences where they enjoy a love of literature, whilst also developing their skills, strategies and phonological awareness to equip them as they learn to become readers. Learning to read successfully is something that we pride ourselves on here at Camperdown College for all students.

Students have their own book box filled with 'just right' texts that are engaging and readable. Students have a mix of stories, non-fiction texts and decodable readers that allow comprehensive phonics skills to be applied correctly and with success. Prep students read from these books daily in a comfortable place within the classroom (and some days with a friend!), practising essential skills that set them up for a wonderful and successful journey as a reader.

**Writing:** Prep students engage in the writing process from the very first day of school at Camperdown College. Students apply their phonics knowledge when engaging in written communication. Quickly, students are able to write about situations and experiences that they are familiar with, listening to sounds and recognising letters that represent these sounds.

**Mathematics:** Mathematics is a daily occurrence within the Prep room at Camperdown College. A hands-on approach is employed with students forming an understanding of mathematical concepts by manipulating materials and engaging in games that reinforce concepts being explored.







### **Integrated Studies:**

Students undertake a thorough investigation of a topic each term for Integrated Studies. This promotes group work, partner work and an expansion of their comprehension of the world around them. 'Australian Animals', 'The Camperdown Community', 'Families', 'Being Healthy' and 'All About Me' are topics that our Prep students enjoy learning about through group work, craft activities and technology based projects. Students are also exposed to STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) activities and music within the classroom. We explore our local community on many excursions and trips to bring this learning to life and expand our developing understanding of the world around us.

Prep students at Camperdown College enjoy house sporting carnivals, including athletics and cross country. Our swimming program, which commences in Term 4 for our Prep students, teaches vital swimming skills with qualified swimming instructors and is a real highlight of the year.

The house system has been set up to cater for both competitive and non-competitive activities. These may include such activities as sport, yard duty, Swimming, Athletics and Cross Country Carnivals and citizenship activities. The houses are Bullen Merri (red), Leura (yellow) and Manifold (green). In most cases, all students in the same family will belong to the same house.

Prep students at Camperdown College participate in one session of Physical Education per week. Sessions are planned meticulously by Mr Attrill and focus on developing gross motor skills such as running, hopping and throwing. Students in Prep – Year 2 also take part in a session of Sport per week. This takes place at the Junior Campus where all students in Prep – Year 2 partake in various sports and games together.

# Camps, Excursions & Incursions

A sequential camping program is offered from Prep – Year 6 at Camperdown College.

Camperdown College is a Sunsmart school. The policy requires Junior Campus students to wear a broad brimmed school uniform hat on days when the UV rating is 3 or above. ## **Bicycles:**

Unless the distance from home to school is too great, we urge you to support your children to walk or ride to school. Walking and riding are healthier alternatives, although the use of bicycles without supervision can be a safety concern, especially for children younger than ten years old.

Where a bicycle is used it is wise to undertake regular safety checks and give a reminder on traffic rules and laws. In accordance with Safety Traffic Regulations children are required to wear approved safety helmets when riding bicycles. Children should remember that, if they use the school crossings, they must walk across, not ride their bicycles. Children are not to ride bicycles or scooters in the playground when travelling to and from school.

## **Bus Travel: (bus travel is free to your closest government school)**

This is organised by the Senior Campus. Junior Campus pick up is from the McKinnon Street gate. Students are supervised by Bus Duty teachers until the bus travellers arrive in the morning and depart in the afternoon.

Each Prep (or new student) bus traveller is assigned a bus buddy. This bus buddy helps each child get on the correct bus safely after the school day.

Students travel to the Senior Campus, where some students change to their home bus. Any changes to normal bus travel arrangements will require parents to phone the office or write a note explaining the changes each time. Even students who are not regular travellers need a note each time they use the bus service.

## **School Crossings:**

These are provided in Brooke Street and Walls Street. Crossing Supervisors have been employed to assist children using both crossings. Children are expected to obey the Crossing Supervisor's instructions.

#### Compass:

Camperdown College parents are encouraged to sign up for our online communication and assessment portal, Compass. You will be able to access Compass via computer, tablet or mobile phone (iPhone or android) by downloading the Compass School Manager app from the Apple or Android app store or using the web address:  
<https://camperdowncoll-vic.compass.education/>.

Compass enables you to view the learning cycles that your child is working on as well as providing you with a progress report every six weeks. Parent Teacher Interview bookings are also made through Compass.

Through the parent portal you can view your child's up-to-date class and school attendance information, approve or enter upcoming or past absences for your son/daughter, update your registered email and mobile number (used for SMS alerts) details, access the College calendar and see information about camps and excursions and view your child's reports.

All new parents/guardians will be sent home the appropriate information to be able to register with Compass.

#### Newsletter:

A key source of communication with parents at Camperdown College is our school newsletter, the Camperdown Contact. This is distributed to students weekly on Thursday afternoons. The youngest student in each family at Camperdown College receives the newsletter.

Parents are advised to seek out the newsletter each week as it contains news on a wide range of issues relevant to the College, to education generally and to the community. Important dates, response slips, changes to school routines, meeting details and opportunities for celebrations are also included. A calendar of events and community information is also included as a regular feature. Spare copies are available from the Junior Campus Office.

Alternatively, parents are able to have the newsletter emailed to them each week. It is also available to view at any time on Compass and Skoolbag.

#### School Website:

The Camperdown College website (<http://camperdowncoll.vic.edu.au>) is another way to keep up to date with what is going on at Camperdown College. The newsletter and calendar of events are added weekly along with extended information about upcoming events.

#### Skoolbag:

Keep up to date with regular happenings at Camperdown College by downloading our Skoolbag app. It is free for you from the App Store for Apple users or Google Play Store for Android users. You will receive regular reminders sent to your phone via push notifications and can lodge your child's absences if they happen to be away from school. The current newsletter and uniform and canteen price lists are also available to view as well as an up to date calendar of events.

The Camperdown College school fees are kept to a minimum and are an essential part of meeting our school needs. They fund the purchase of student requisites such as ICT equipment, paper, books and class sets of text books, photocopies and other essential equipment. They do not cover the cost of camps and excursions.

#### School Fees:

As a guide, the cost for Essential Learning Items for students in Prep – Year 4 in 2020 was \$164 per year while Year 5/6 students were charged \$175 per year. This included Technology Provision (computer/iPad use, associated software, IT support, printing and Compass software), class sets/reading resources/supplementary materials and a Camperdown College Student Organiser (also used as a home reading log).

#### Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF):

Any parent in possession of a Commonwealth Pensioner Health Benefits Card is entitled to apply for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) in respect of each child aged 5 to 15 years. Application forms are available from the College at the beginning of the year. Parents may use their CSEF to meet costs of camps, sports, excursions and other costs by making an agreement with the College.

#### Lunch Service:

Prep – Year 6 students at Camperdown College are able to order their lunch each day from Camperdown Country Roasts & Salads. A menu is sent home at the beginning of the year and is available at any time on our website, Skoolbag App or Compass. When students order their lunch, they must complete an order form (available from the Junior Campus Office or in each classroom), place it in a zip lock bag with the correct change and in their lunch order box (located in each classroom). These are collected from the Junior Campus, prepared and returned just in time for lunch. We discourage Prep students from having a lunch order in the first month whilst they are settling into school.

Camperdown College has a strong commitment to maintaining high standards, including personal presentation.

Students are expected to wear school uniform and present themselves in a clean and tidy manner.

Please note that uniform items are only available from the Uniform Shop which is located at the Senior Campus. The

Uniform Shop is open on Wednesdays from 3.15pm – 4.00pm and Fridays from 8.15am – 9.00am and 3.15pm – 4.00pm (although we can make exceptions for new families). Please see below for a full list of the Junior Campus school uniform.

#### Out of Uniform Days:

During the school year, the Junior School Council runs *Out of Uniform Days* to raise money for a variety of charities.

Students can choose to come dressed in casual clothes on these days.

#### Sport Uniform:

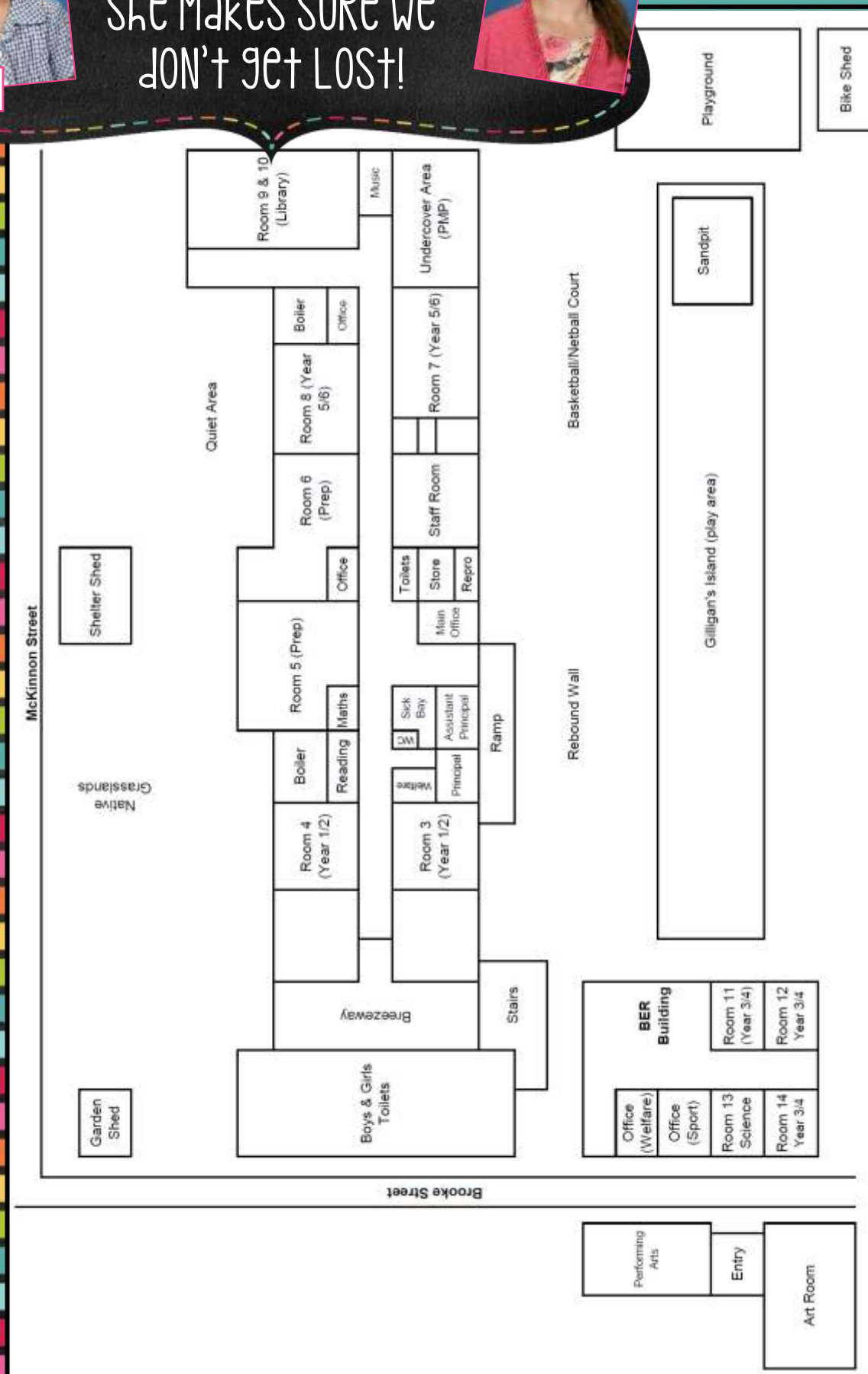
