The students were excited for the visit and learnt so much about Bailey's achievement to place on the podium from 160 riders.

We were priviledged to have Bailey back in the very room he once learned in during his time here at the Junior Campus before going onto the Senior Campus where he earnt the title of 2021 Dux.

Students listened attentively as Bailey covered the mechanics of his state-ofthe-art bike and were very impressed with his third-place medallion and the special jersey acknowledging him as the best placed young rider.

There were some standout moments of the visit including reuniting the superstar with his 2021 Prep Buddy Imogen Donlan (pictured right). Imogen was thrilled Bailey remembered her and was very proud to hold the medals during the visit.

We really can't thank Bailey enough for taking time out of his busy and no doubt exhausting schedule to visit and inspire our students. We would also like to extend our congratulations to past student Riley Helmore who also rode in the event. We can't help but wonder if we'll see a few more students on their bikes riding to school in the coming weeks!?

# FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK...



Welcome back to the start of another exciting school year.

In particular, I'd like to welcome our Preps, new students and their families and our teaching and support staff commencing this year and joining our vibrant and highly regarded College community.

I hope everyone has had the opportunity to rest and recharge and

are looking forward to the year with real optimism with lots of exciting programs and development planned.

We have welcomed thirty-six students in Prep and thirty-two students in Year 7 who have all made a confident transition to their new environment. It has been pleasing to see the older students at both campuses assisting students in the playground and navigating classrooms. Along with students at other year levels, we have welcomed eight new teachers. Rohan Adams, Darcie Seers, Grace Croker and Sage Bolton have all commenced at the Junior Campus in various year levels. Sondi Guthrie, Tanisha Dooley and Adele McGuane are teaching Maths/Science, English and PE/Health respectively and have been joined by returning teachers Julie McPhee and Peter Rock who are assisting in a part-time capacity. In addition, Sara Magnusson has returned two days a week from family leave to take History and PE. Intervention is being conducted across the campuses by Nicole Date, Julie Nelson, Judy Downie and Sheryl Currie. Finally, Trish Gibson commenced work in the Senior Campus Office this week learning the role of the Business Manager prior to Mardi taking leave.

Cherie Kilpatrick was appointed to the substantive Senior Educational Improvement Leader position for the South West Region over the holidays. She will return to farewell the students at our Leadership Induction Ceremony later this term. Cherie will be sadly missed but leaves wonderful legacies brought about through her visionary leadership journey which over ten years improved all aspects of our school culture and attainment. School Council is in the process of recruiting a new Principal with the final outcome to be announced mid-March.

One key focus this year is actioning our 2023 Annual Implementation Plan which was developed after our school review last year. The plan aims to further enhance student voice and agency and continue to the work to progress the Berry Street Educational Model. Along side this we will be working at ensuring learning growth is maximised for each student.

For Year 11 and 12 students, 2023 sees the introduction of the inaugural two-year VCE Vocational Major Certificate – part of a once-in-a-generation change to senior secondary education that will provide a more cohesive link between school, study and work, and give students better access to high-quality relevant vocational education and applied learning opportunities. This certificate has replaced the VCAL certificate and runs alongside the general VCE program.

Congratulations to Sarah Brooks and Senior Campus HAPL students who were filmed last year by the University of NSW to showcase their learning for the Department's High Ability Toolkit (a resource for teachers). 


# Year 3-6 Swimming:


