#### **Prep – Year 2 Reading Information Night:**

The Prep – Year 2 team will be running an information session for parents on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> March from 3.30pm – 4pm. Information will be provided on how to support your child with home reading and phonics engagement. Sounds-Write phonics packs for home will also be handed out to families in attendance on the night. Parents of our Prep – Year 2 students are encouraged to attend this event. For those unable to make it, packs will be sent home with students. Child minding is available on the night for school age and pre-school children.

#### **Ilbijerri Theatre Company Incursion:**

On Monday, Prep – Year 6 students will be treated to a cultural incursion with a whole school performance set to start the week. The performance titled *Get Your Geek On* will be performed by members of the Ilbijerri ensemble which is an artist development program open to Australian First Nations emerging theatre practitioners, young people and community members aged 15+. After this whole school performance, our Year 3/4 students will be involved in workshops with the Ilbijerri performers to explore themes and the performance further. We thank Mr Bennett for organising this special performance for our students.

#### **NAPLAN:**

Students in Year 3 and 5 will be participating in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy in a few weeks time with testing beginning on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> March and concluding on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> March. NAPLAN will again be conducted in Term 1. The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. Our Year 3 and Year 5 students are embracing this opportunity to showcase their skills and will continue preparing over the coming weeks. Further information will be sent home with students next week.

#### **English Online Interview for Year 1 students:**

The English Online Interview (EOI) is mandatory for all Year 1 students in Victorian government schools with our students set to complete this task with their teacher in the week beginning Monday 4<sup>th</sup> March. This reading assessment is something our Prep students have been busy undertaking as part of their individual interviews scheduled on a Wednesday (or before school started).

#### **Junior School Council:**

Our newly elected Junior School Council (JSC) have started preparing our major fundraisers and special day for our students this term which we are very excited about. Led by Mr Adams, the JSC are preparing our school's participation in Epilepsy Action Australia 2024 Purple Day Make March Purple on Tuesday 20th March. Students and staff are invited to show their support for people living with epilepsy by wearing purple for a gold coin donation. Camperdown College has a number of families who live with epilepsy, making this cause extra special and one that is close to our hearts. This event helps to encourage both staff and students to have conversations celebrating difference and how important it is to embrace everyone as we are all unique and special in our own way.

The first Purple Day event was on March 26<sup>th</sup> 2008 and was motivated by a Canadian school girl's struggle with epilepsy. In the years that followed, epilepsy organisations around the world began recognising March 26<sup>th</sup> as an international day of epilepsy awareness.

From the beginning of March, our Junior School Council will be selling purple ribbons that students can purchase for \$1, with students encouraged to wear these with pride on the days leading up to Purple Day. This year's ribbons will feature a sunflower that signifies a special meaning. On the day there will be fingernail painting and other fun activities to help raise awareness and funds that will be donated to Epilepsy Action Australia, so that they may continue to support and assist those living with epilepsy.




# EAD II/IJ HSSSD CRICKET




# Have you registered for Compass

# Mobile Phone CAMPERDOWN Blitz 2024

A reminder that the Department of Education has in place a mobile phone ban that requires students who bring mobiles phones to school to have them switched off and securely put away during school hours. The Department is requiring all schools to ensure this ban is in place and reinforced from the start of the 2024 school year. The ban applies equally to all government schools right across the state.

This helps ensure that school is a learning environment free from unnecessary distractions and disruptions. By ensuring mobile phones are kept away at recess and lunch times, students can interact with each other face-to-face, without the distractions and social pressures that mobile phones can cause. 


