It is a set of procedures and measures for assessing the acquisition of literacy skills. They are designed to be short fluency measures that can be used to regularly detect risk and monitor the development of early literacy and early reading skills. This understanding coupled with all that sits around Sounds-Write ensures our students get off to the best start possible with their reading and writing through an evidence-based approach.

Melissa Wood, Jacinta Tolland and Lewis Osborne have embarked on a nine month course through the Victorian

Academy of Teaching and Leadership on Leading Mathematics. This program is highly regarded and supports the team to investigate, analyse and strengthen current approaches to mathematics learning, teaching and leadership at the classroom, team and school-wide levels.

Jacinta and I attended the Principals' Forum in Hamilton earlier this week. A number of state-wide and regional foci were presented as was a range of data. One of the concerning trends across our region at present is the increasing student absence data. Being at school, ready for learning every day has so many benefits, not only for academic growth but for social and relational development. We have been mandated to report students who have had more than five unexplained absences by the end of week 6 to the region. If you are having any challenges in getting your child to school on a regular basis, please reach out.

We have been fortunate to have had wonderful weather conditions for our swimming program and carnivals. It has been great to see all students participating in the primary program. Thank you to Kim Wines and Grace Lee for organising the swimming carnivals and congratulations to students on their participation.

Students in Year 3 and 5 will be participating in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy in a few weeks time with testing beginning on Wednesday 15th March and concluding on Monday 27th March. This year, is the first year NAPLAN will be conducted in Term 1, with this national assessment previously delivered in Term 2. The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. Our Year 3 and 5 students are embracing this opportunity to showcase their skills and will continue preparing over the coming weeks. Further information will be sent home with students early next week.

English Online Interview for Year 1 students:

From this year, the English Online Interview (EOI) is mandatory for all Year 1 students in Victorian government schools. This reading assessment is something our Prep students have been busy undertaking as part of their individual interviews scheduled on a Wednesday (or before school started). This year, we are looking forward to implementing this assessment with our Year 1 students with testing occurring during the school day within the next fortnight.

TheirCare – Out of School Hours Care Program:

We have many of our families utilising our out of school hours care program, TheirCare, which is wonderful to see. If your child is attending TheirCare, please remind them to collect their hat upon pick up and leave in their school bag for the following day to ensure they are ready for play at recess and lunch. Searching for a spare hat can cause distress for some students, and students know there is nothing better than wearing your own hat!

Junior School Council:

Our newly elected Junior School Council (JSC) have been busy preparing two major fundraisers and special days for our students this term which we are very excited about. 

Our school is trained and implementing the Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) from Prep right through to Year 12. Have you heard your child mention 'brain breaks'? or 'welcome circles'? These are two elements that we have implemented this year with all classes to increase engagement and successfully improve all students' self-regulation, relationships, wellbeing, growth and academic achievement.

Join us on our journey of launching common language in all classrooms across our Junior and Senior Campuses.



WELCOME CIRCLES

Over the last few weeks, classes and homegroups have started to implement *Welcome Circles* into their daily predictable routines, as a part of the Berry Street Education Model (BSEM).

Every morning we will start our day with a Welcome Circle, which involves students coming together to form positive connections with their peers and staff. This routine helps to create a sense of safety and belonging that can support student engagement, build wellbeing and create positive classroom communities. During this routine students and staff will be able to check in, frame expectations for the day and nurture meaningful relationships. The Welcome Circle, includes six elements:

1. GREETINGS:

- Greetings involve students coming together as a class either sitting or standing in a circle shape.
- When staff and students greet someone by name it promotes a sense of belonging, boosts academic engagement and can reduce disruptive behaviour.
- During the greeting students are encouraged to greet their fellow classmates by using their names in a positive manner.

2. VALUES:

- It is important for students to feel connected to our school values every day and to foster a sense of belonging to our school community.
- Every week students will examine one of our school values and discuss what that value might look like in the classroom and playground.

3. EXPECTATIONS:

- Together students and teachers can share key expectations for a positive behaviour for the week.
- Students and staff will work together to choose a behaviour focus for the week. Each day they will check in to see how they are tracking at achieving these desired behaviours.

4. ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- This is an opportunity, for students to share any personal news or announcements including birthdays, accomplishments or special events.
- It allows students to make connections to their local community and become aware of nationwide- or global events, celebrations and days of significance.

5. POSITIVE PRIMERS:

- Positive primers are activities or games that prime students' brains for engaged, creative and flexible thinking.
- Starting a lesson or school day with a positive primer adds to student connection, collaboration and enjoyment.

6. WHAT WENT WELL?

- Is a reflection strategy that helps students to recognise the positive aspects of a lesson or day.
- Students are encouraged to 'shout out' or acknowledge things they did well or recognise a peer's effort in the morning circle, during an activity or a lesson.

We look forward to seeing the positive changes and connections that Welcome Circles will bring into our school community.

JUNIOR CAMPUS SPORT & PE

Last week and this week, our *Year 3 – 6 students* participated in their seven-day *swimming program* and what perfect weather we have had! All students took part in the our program that was run by the Splash Factory from Warrnambool. Our students demonstrated nothing but respect for their swimming instructors by listening and taking on feedback to improve their swimming skills. Some key skills that students have learnt are to propel their body on the front and back using freestyle, backstroke, breaststroke and survival backstroke for 10 to 20 metres and demonstrating sound breathing and stroke techniques.



The *Prep – Year 2 students* have continued to explore the locomotor skills of *catching* and *running*. Some key skills we have been practicing when running are starting with a standing start, eyes forward, bent elbows, and ‘chopping’ or ‘punching’ the air. We have also been learning how to successfully hold and pass a baton to run in relay races for the Athletics Carnival. Students have also been playing warm-up games that encourage teamwork, encouragement and following instructions. The Year 1 – 6 students are playing the game ‘Sprout’ for our warm-up game this week. Our Prep students are playing the game ‘Beanbag Grab’ as their new warm-up game.
