FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK...



Mother's Day Breakfast:

Thank you to everyone who attended this morning's Mother's Day Breakfast and also to those who helped set up and assisted with gifts for the Mother's Day Stall. These events are always so well attended and we appreciate the connection they build within the community. We are extremely lucky to have such hard working mothers at our college,

both as parents, grandparents, staff and volunteers. I hope our mothers have a lovely day on Sunday and feel appreciated for all the wonderful work you do.

Education Week:

Education Week runs next week from Monday 13th May to Friday 17th May. The theme, *Spotlight on STEM*, celebrates the importance of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics in our everyday lives, in the classroom and beyond. During this week, we will be *opening* the Junior Campus on Thursday 16th May to current families/friends and then putting our Prep students on show to Kindergarten children on Friday 17th May.

School Saving Bonus:

You may have seen the recent announcement of the School Saving Bonus, as part of the Victorian Budget 2024/25. We will be sharing more information about how families will be able to access and use this support.

This one off support will include \$400 for each eligible student to help families cover the costs of school uniforms and activities in 2025. It will be available to parents and carers of every child enrolled in a Victorian government school in 2025. Cash will not be paid directly to individuals or families. Instead, families will receive the bonus as credits on their school accounts that will help meet the costs of your children's activities and uniforms.

Existing Supports:

The School Saving Bonus support will be in addition to existing and continuing means-tested supports for camps, sports, excursions and uniforms.

The application based Affordable School Uniform program, through State Schools' Relief, will continue to be available to families experiencing financial hardship or other forms of vulnerability and short term crisis. This program allows schools to make multiple applications for support on parents' behalf throughout the year if needed.

There will be more information and guidance about the School Saving Bonus in Term 3 2024, ahead of its implementation in 2025.

Violence in Australian Communities:

This has been a hot topic recently in Australia, across all communities and heavily in the media where we have seen a series of devastating acts of violence, particularly against women. Our beautiful community is not immune to the perils of derogatory comments, violent attitudes and family violence.

Camperdown College is committed to ensuring we do our part. Violence in general and family violence is increasing in Victoria's communities and reportedly 30% of family violence incidents attended by the police involve children.

I am hoping this may provide an opportune time for meaningful *conversations within the home* about violence and support the college's **ZERO tolerance of any form of violence**. Homegroups at the Senior Campus have provided valuable opportunities to have targeted discussions – in our quest to provide the safest environment possible for students, whilst both at school and as they move to become responsible adults.

At school, we will continue to have discussions with students, about *the detrimental influences of social media messaging* and *highlighting* the harmful values that are being shared to millions of adolescents around the world – many of those values being the opposite of the key college values of **Respect and Responsibility**.

Through conversations at home, you may feel your child would benefit from wellbeing assistance. Please reach out to Kathryn Robertson (Wellbeing Officer) and your relevant Year Level Coordinator/Homegroup teacher.

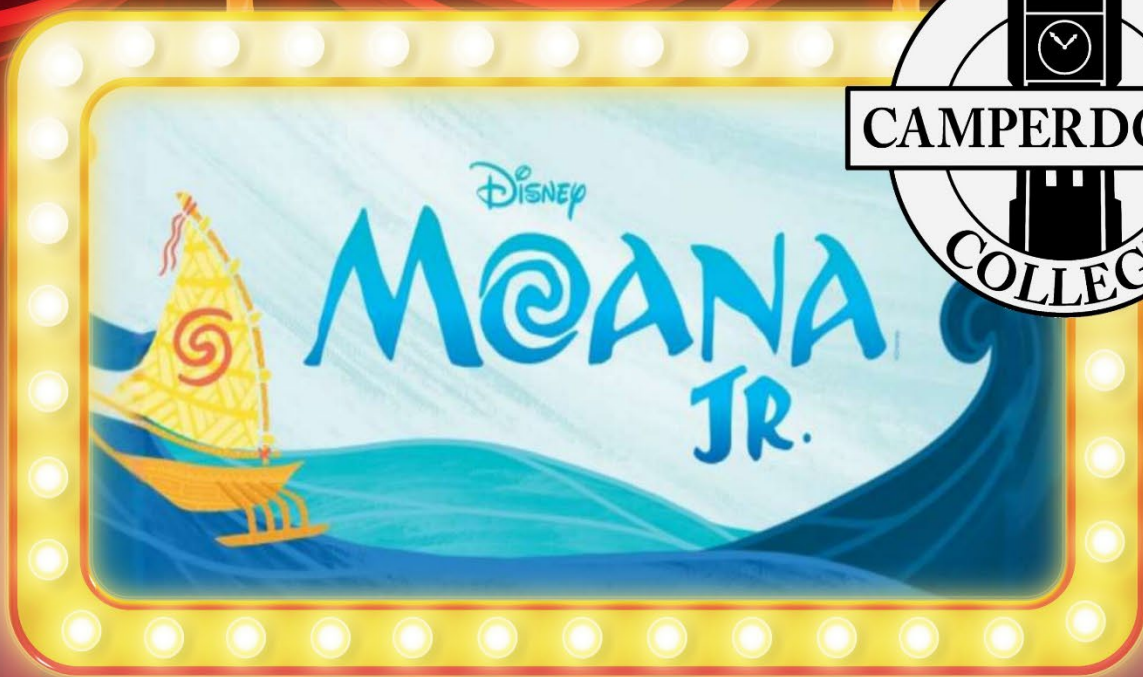

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YEAR 12 BIOLAB EXCURSION

A group of eleven VCE students travelled to the BioLAB Victorian Bioscience Education Centre in Geelong, one of the six science and mathematics specialist centres in the state.

First, students participated in the *Eye in the Sky* workshop, which focussed on GPS data tracking. Students analysed and generated their very own primary data sets in areas such as: work to rest ratios, movement and locomotor patterns and skill frequencies.

They then went on to look at energy systems and the measurement of acute responses to exercise using specialised equipment in the *Metabolic Madness* workshop.

Students were able to make deep connections to their classroom coursework and establish hands-on understandings of how these technologies can support athletes.
