



BERRYSTREET EDUCATION MODEL

Curriculum and Classroom Strategies

This year, staff at the Junior Campus have been utilising brain breaks to help support students' learning. Staff implement these into lessons every day, as a part of the Berry Street Education Model (BSEM).

Our aim for brain breaks this year was to get our students involved in the decision making, to allow opportunities for them to develop their self-awareness by checking in with themselves and asking 'Do we need a brain break?' If our students recognised that they needed a brain break, then they would tune into their bodies and decide what type of brain break is needed, an escalating or de-escalating brain break.

AN ESCALATING BRAIN BREAK BRINGS THE ENERGY UP!

A DE-ESCALATING BRAIN BREAK HELPS CALM OUR BODIES

Students from Year 1/2 have thoroughly enjoyed participating in a wide variety of brain breaks and they have selected some their favourites to share. You might like to try these at home to help you improve your self-regulation skills.

SPOTLIGHT YEAR 1/2



Adele: Quiet mouse: you lie down to de-escalate while listening to music.

Archie: Buzz: we sit in a circle and count by 5's and if we get to 50, we buzz and we are out.

Dustin: Meditation: we listen to a calming voice while laying down. It helps us if we are too active.

Hamish: Freeze dance: we watch a clip and copy the dance moves that the people are doing. It helps us feel happy.

Harlen: Continuous drawing: we have to draw a picture, but we can't look at what we are drawing or take our pencil off the paper.

Heidi: Just Dance: if you're feeling sad, you might want to move your body and dance so we follow the dance moves.

Hyedi: Bobs and Statues: we listen to music and when the music stops, we must quickly bob or become a statue.

Keeley: Four Corners: we number each corner 1 to 4, we pick a corner to stand in. Miss Coker rolls the dice, if she rolls a 1,2, 3 or 4, that corner is out. If it is a 5 or 6, we are all safe.

Lily: Balloon bounce: we sit in a circle and tap the balloon in the air until it pops.

Opie: Yoga: we quietly make different poses with our bodies. This helps our bodies to be calm.

Ruaraidh: Fitness Run: we have to dodge, duck and jump over obstacles in the video. It helps us to de-escalate.

Skye: Rock Paper Scissors Evolution: you play normal rock, paper, scissors but first you start off as an egg. If you win, you grow into

a chicken, if you win again you evolve into a dinosaur. It is really fun!





Our students demonstrated leadership, resilience and communicated fantastic ideas. Overall, they represented Camperdown College to a high level. It was a outstanding experience for all.


