

Curriculum and Classroom Strategies

### De-escalation: Calm Down kits

De-escalation is an important skill for all of us to learn, as we can all feel overwhelmed and angry at times. By being able to learn how to recognise our emotions, identify our needs and actively use strategies to de-escalate in a safe and appropriate manner, we can become present, centred and grounded individuals.


Through the Berry Street Education Model, staff have actively been working with our students to learn how to recognise and name their emotions and provide support to help them to regulate these emotions using de-escalation strategies. This could look like de-escalating Brain Breaks, checking in with our students using the Ready to Learn Scales and students using their class' Ready to Learn Plans.

This term, students at the Junior Campus have been introduced to the de-escalating strategy of Calm Down Kits. These kits will be used to support the work that staff and students have done to develop their classe' Ready to Learn Scales and Ready to Learn Plans. Students are learning to use these scales and plans to help them to recognise how they are feeling and assist them to select de-escalating strategies to regulate these emotions.


A Calm Down Kit is a tool used to support students when they need a break or assistance in regulating their emotions. This could look like exploring these kits in a quiet space or selecting one item from the kit and using it during whole class lessons to help with their focus, attention and active listening. Our Calm Down Kits contain a variety of helpful resources including fidget tools, construction blocks and an array of sensory items that students can use to develop their self-regulation skills. These kits are located in every classroom and specialist learning space, so that they are easily accessible for all students.

We look forward to seeing the positive impact that these calm down kits have on our student's ability to develop their regulation skills.
