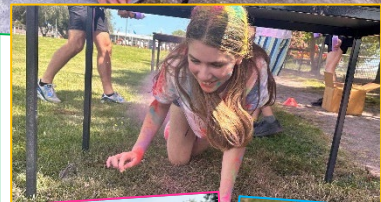

# FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK...



It's that time of year where we are quickly running out of days in the school year. It is a very exciting time in schools, celebrating the current year and planning for the next. **The final school day for 2023 for Prep – Year 9 students will be Friday 15<sup>th</sup> December, finishing at 3.15pm.**

## **Prep classes of 2024:**

Yesterday, we thoroughly enjoyed welcoming the Prep classes of 2024 to Camperdown College for a full morning of orientation. Along with Campus Principal (and current Prep teacher) Jacinta Tolland, I appreciated the opportunity to spend time with our incoming families, whilst 2024 Prep teachers, Kim Robertson and Grace Coker gave the students another wonderful taste of school life.

## **State-wide Orientation Day (Step Up Day) 2023:**

In the lead up to the state-wide orientation day on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> December, key staff will be meeting with Year 7 students and families joining us from feeder schools. This is an important part of the process of establishing a strong partnership between school and home and supporting new students and families in their transition to Camperdown College.

## **Junior Campus Class Structures 2024:**

On **Step Up Day**, students will spend time in their 2024 classes at the Junior Campus where the following class structure will be in place next year:

- Prep x 2 classes
- Year 1/2 x 3 classes
- Year 3/4 x 3 classes
- Year 5/6 x 2 classes

This is a slight shift from this year's model due to a larger distribution of students at Year 3/4 in 2024 than in Year 5/6. Class sizes will be at a healthy average of under 20. The college has focussed on funding smaller class sizes at Year 3/4 to continue to support this cohort (the Prep/Year 1 students most interrupted in their first years of learning during COVID-19 times).

**Recruitment processes for 2024** have been ongoing and are coming to a close. So far this term, I am extremely pleased to announce that we have been able to secure the services of some of the newer staff to the college again into 2024. We are extremely happy to have secured these valuable staff members in a tough recruitment environment for schools. We are so pleased they see Camperdown College as the place to be and are continuing with us in 2024:

- Mr Rohan Adams as a primary classroom teacher
- Mrs Patricia Gibson as Business Manager
- Mrs Lee Kavenagh to Senior Librarian
- Mrs Theresa Corrigan as Administration Assistant

They are all great staff that contributed immensely to the college this year.

We also welcome one of a few new faces to the college next year:

- Miss Jorja Cook in an Education Support role across both campuses.

The College is also in the final stages of appointing (any day now):

- Two primary classroom generalists to replace the wonderful Kathryn Wilde and Jacinta Tolland. 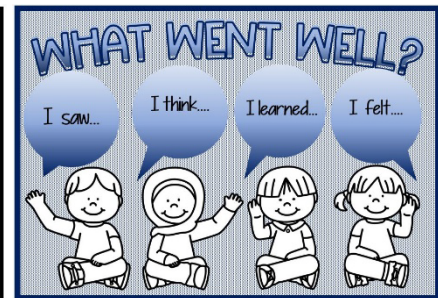
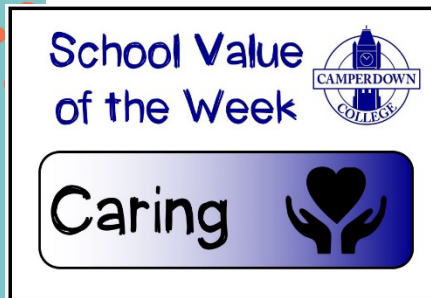
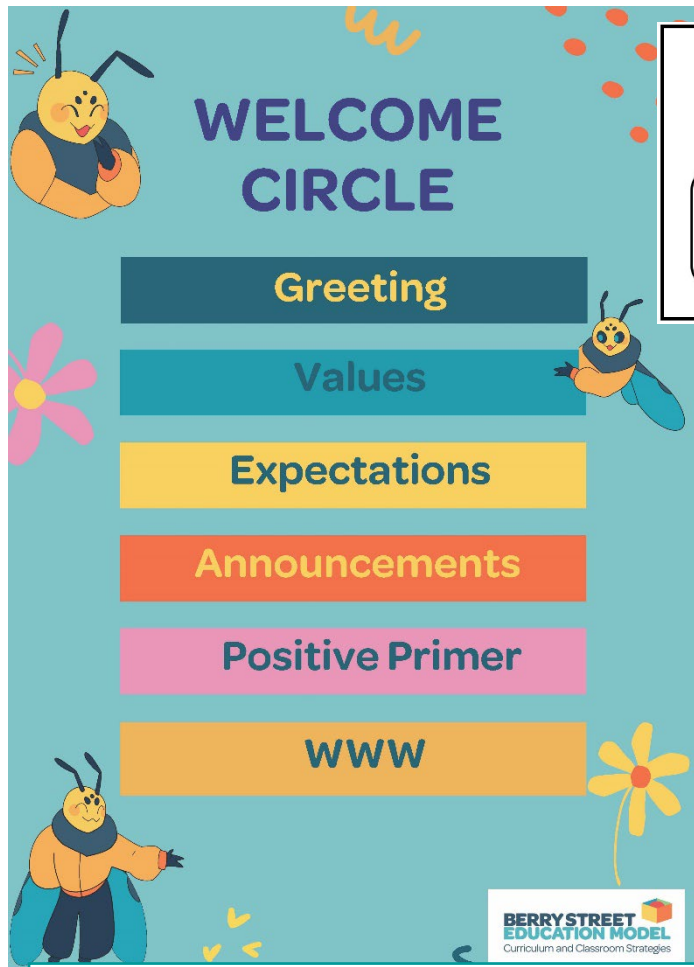


# BERRY STREET EDUCATION MODEL

Curriculum and Classroom Strategies



## WELCOME CIRCLES



In Term 1, welcome circles were introduced as a new addition to our predictable morning routines. Each morning our classes start their day with a welcome circle. A welcome circle is a pro-active de-escalation strategy that helps to create a sense of safety and belonging that supports student engagement, wellbeing and creates positive classroom environments. There are six elements to welcome circles that are included daily in our classrooms, with each classroom focusing on the first four elements: greetings, values, classroom expectations and announcements. Our specialist staff focus on the last two elements: positive primers and what went well reflections by building them into their lessons. It has been amazing to see how much of an impact welcome circles have had on our students and how they have become an integral part of our day. Here is a peek into welcome circles in Year 5/6A.

### SPOTLIGHT ON Year 5/6A

**Greeting:** In Year 5/6A we come together and sit in a circle on the floor. For our morning greeting, we complete the roll and say good morning.

**Values:** During our welcome circle we talk about the school value for the week and give examples of how we can show it in our classroom, in the school yard and at home. Or where we have seen examples of this value previously.

**Classroom expectations:** As a class we discuss what expectation we would like to focus on for the week. We choose an area that we think will help us in our learning.

**Announcements:** On Monday mornings, we write in our school diaries the events that are on for the week. We then read the bulletin each morning. We share personal achievements and special things in our lives with our class and sometimes all the Year 5/6 students.

**What Went Well:** We talk about what went well for us this week or on the weekend, we talk about what we are looking forward this week to and what we are grateful for.

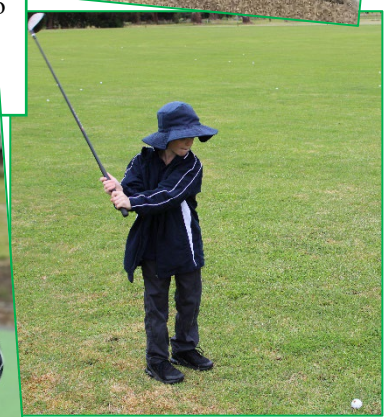
## Prep – Year 2 Swimming:

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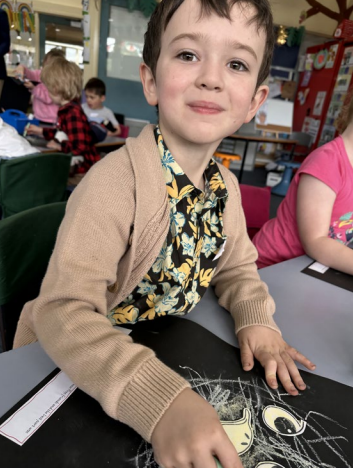


# Gnurad-Gundidj Campus

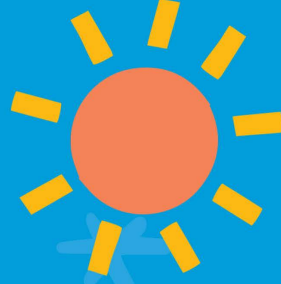
## Weekly themes

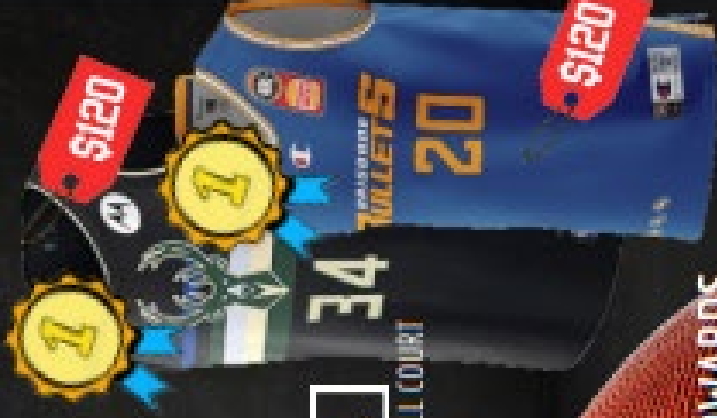
