FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK...

When students learn to recognise these positive experiences, they build gratitude, optimism and confidence. Days like Pirate Day and the Year 12 final assembly give us the perfect opportunity to practise this - celebrating together, feeling joy and being present in the moment.

Whether it's a grand celebration, a special day or a quiet success in the classroom, these moments - big and small - are the treasures that shape our students' sense of belonging and remind us why we do what we do, creating a learning community where every child can find and savour their own 'best days.'

Glasses for Kids Program:

Next week, we are extremely fortunate and excited to be welcoming the Glasses for Kids program to the Junior Campus. Glasses for Kids is proudly ran by State Schools' Relief (SSR) and has been made available to all students at Camperdown College in Prep – Year 3. This program will complete initial vision screens and, if required, will provide eye testing and glasses at **no** cost to families. All screening and testing sessions will be completed during school hours next week between Tuesday 18th November and Friday 21st November. If glasses are required, students can choose their glasses, be fitted with them on the day with the fitted pair of glasses being sent to the school within a few weeks of the visit. SPECIAL REPORT: NEW SOCIAL MEDIA REGULATIONS: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

From Wednesday 10th December 2025, new laws will take effect in Australia to protect young people online by restricting access to social media for those under the age of 16. This important change reflects growing community concern about the impact of early social media use on children's mental health, wellbeing and development.

Research shows that social media can expose children to unrealistic comparisons, online pressure and harmful content long before they are emotionally ready to manage it. While regulation is a positive step forward, real safety begins at home. Families continue to play the most powerful role in helping children build confidence, resilience and awareness in the digital world.

These new regulations provide an opportunity to talk openly with your child about their online experiences and what these changes mean for them. It's also a chance to review family technology habits, reinforce healthy routines, and explore age-appropriate ways for young people to connect, learn and express themselves.

This Special Report explains what the new laws mean in practice and offers practical guidance to help families prepare for the upcoming changes.
